According to Chomsky, modern linguistics, like Descartes, assumes that language is a unique property of human beings and, like Descartes, that the human mind possesses knowledge prior to experience, knowledge about principles of language, shape, number, among others, and that the human mind takes scattered data received through the senses and interprets it using innate principles and structures. And a theory must aim towards accommodating the mental science in question to another science – in the case of language, certainly biology – among other natural sciences. Properties conducive to what is learned were attributed to the mind. Chomsky proposes, "In many respects, it seems to me quite accurate, then, to provide a basis for understanding one another, even at a

young age.
